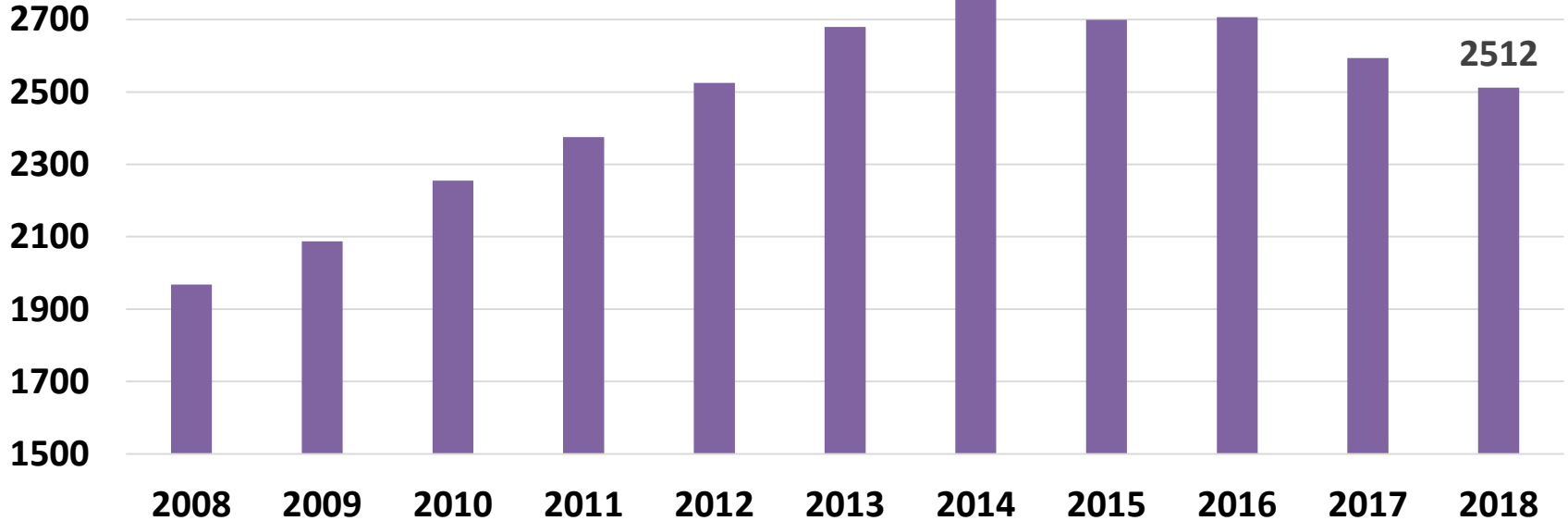

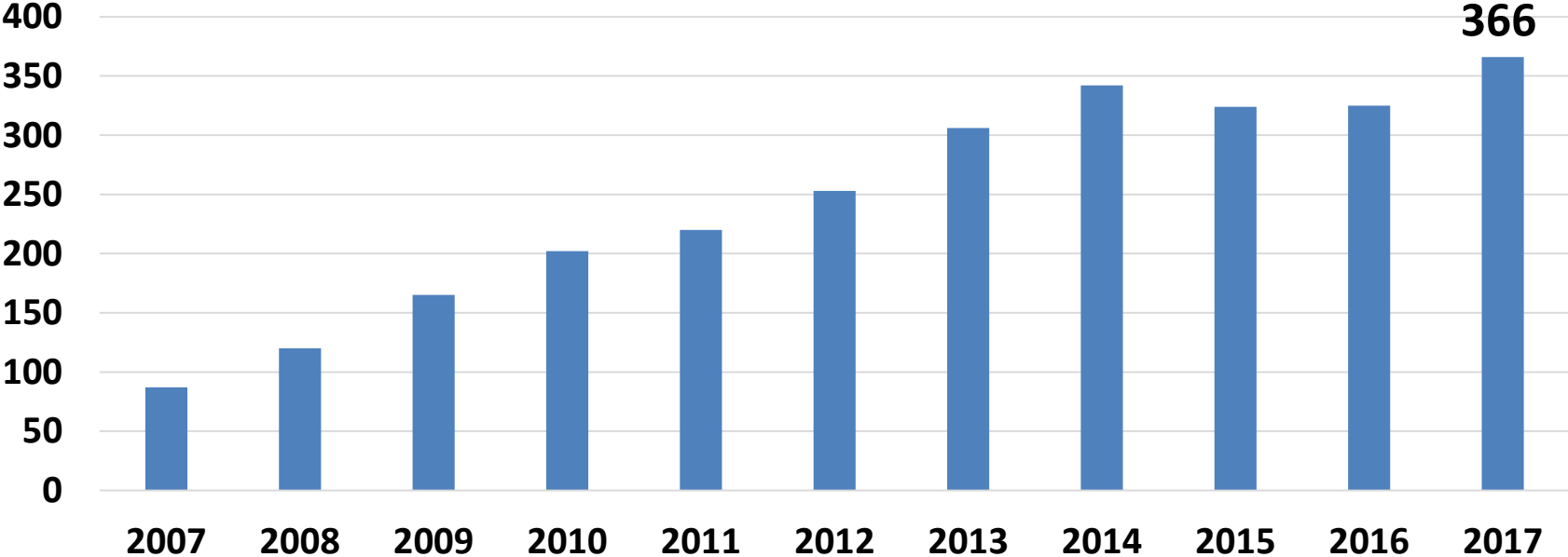

COA Undergraduate Student Enrollment



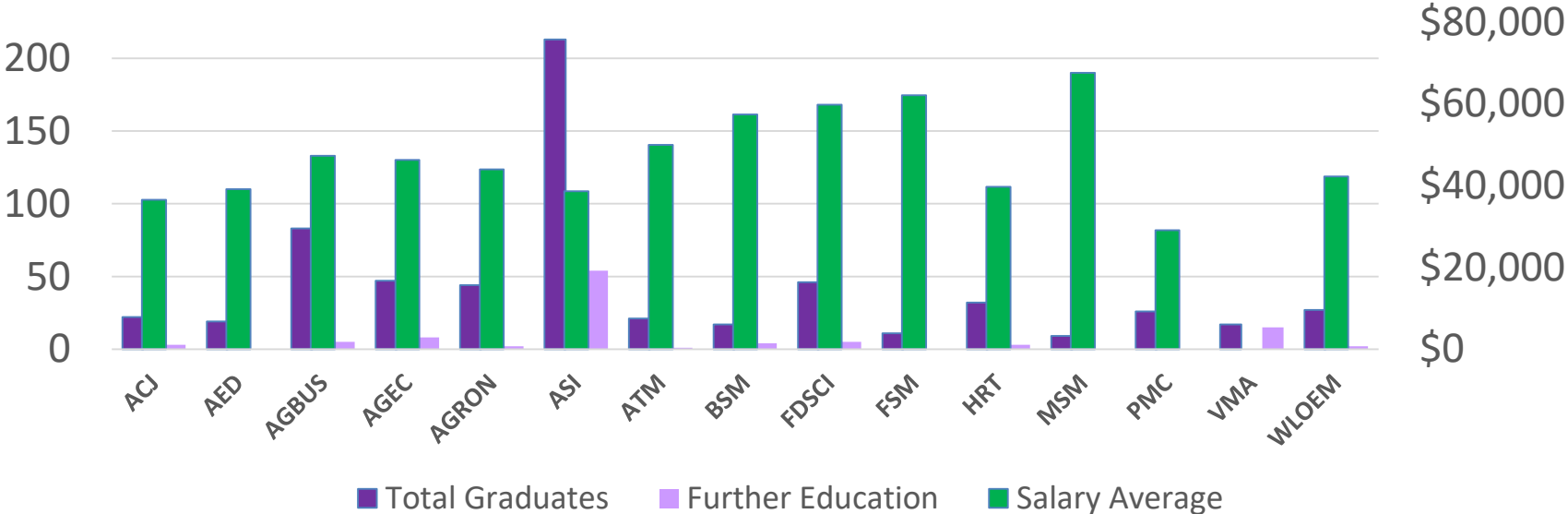
COA Multicultural Student Enrollment



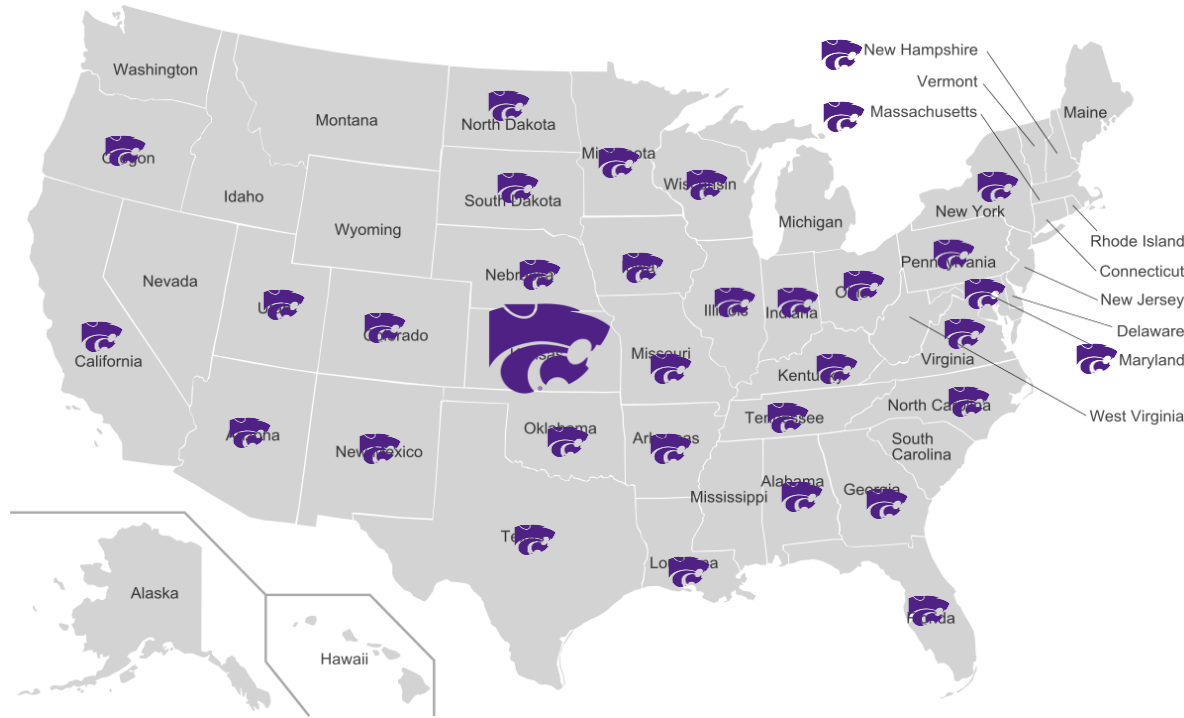

Geographic Placement



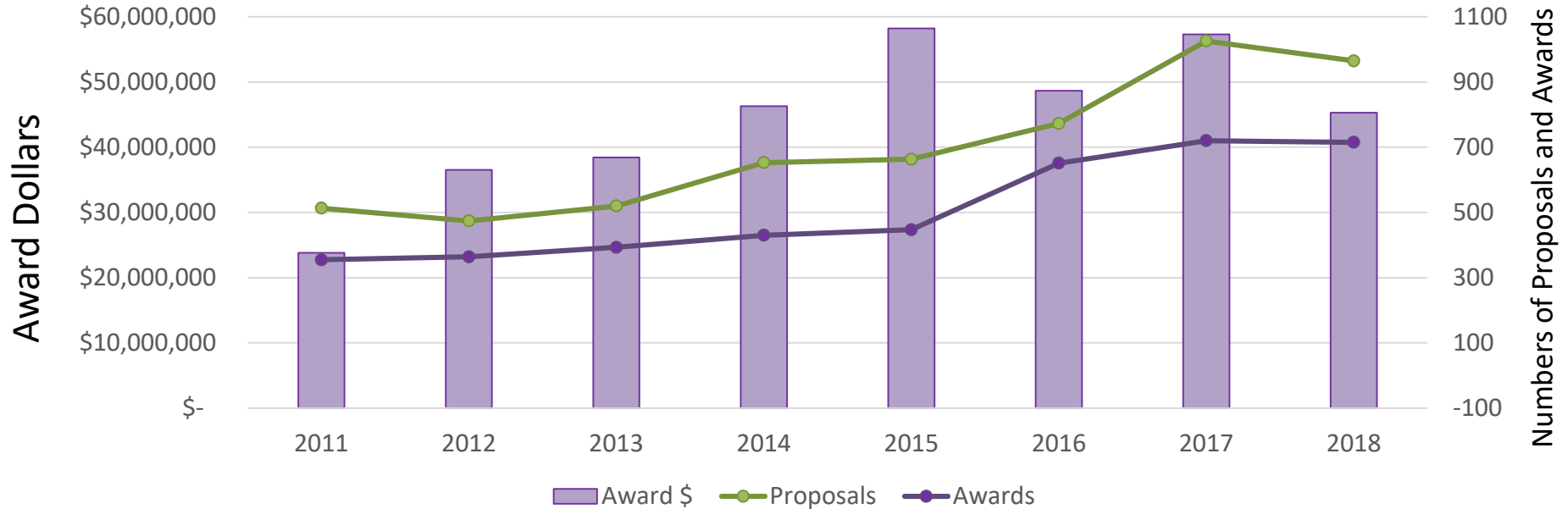
- Nearly 60% of K-State College of Agriculture graduates stay in Kansas
- 98% placement in jobs or furthering education



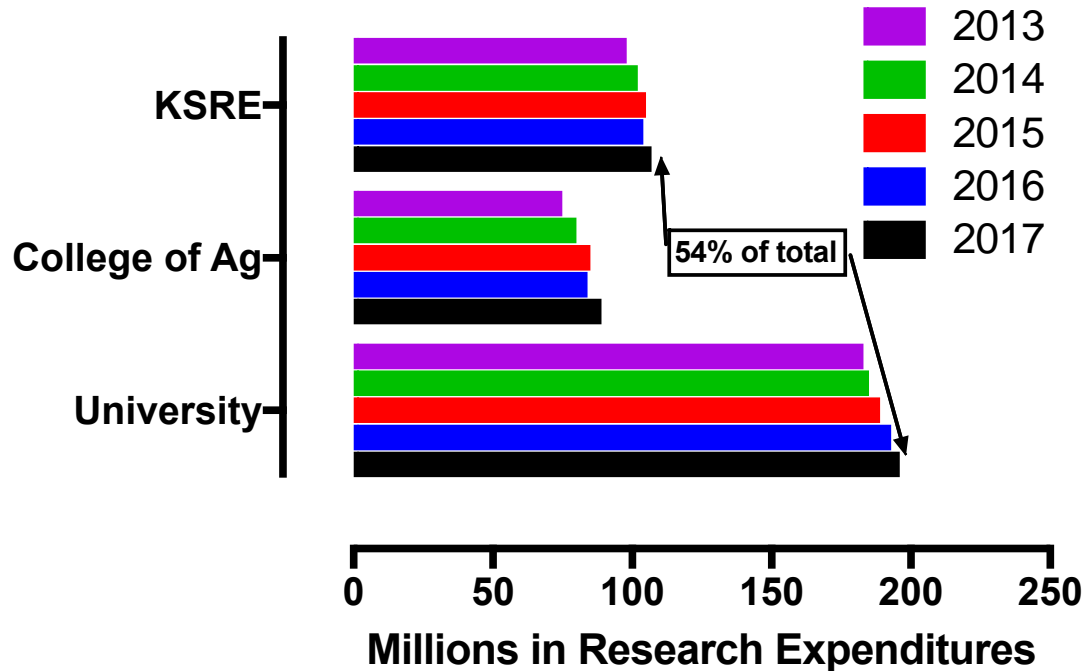

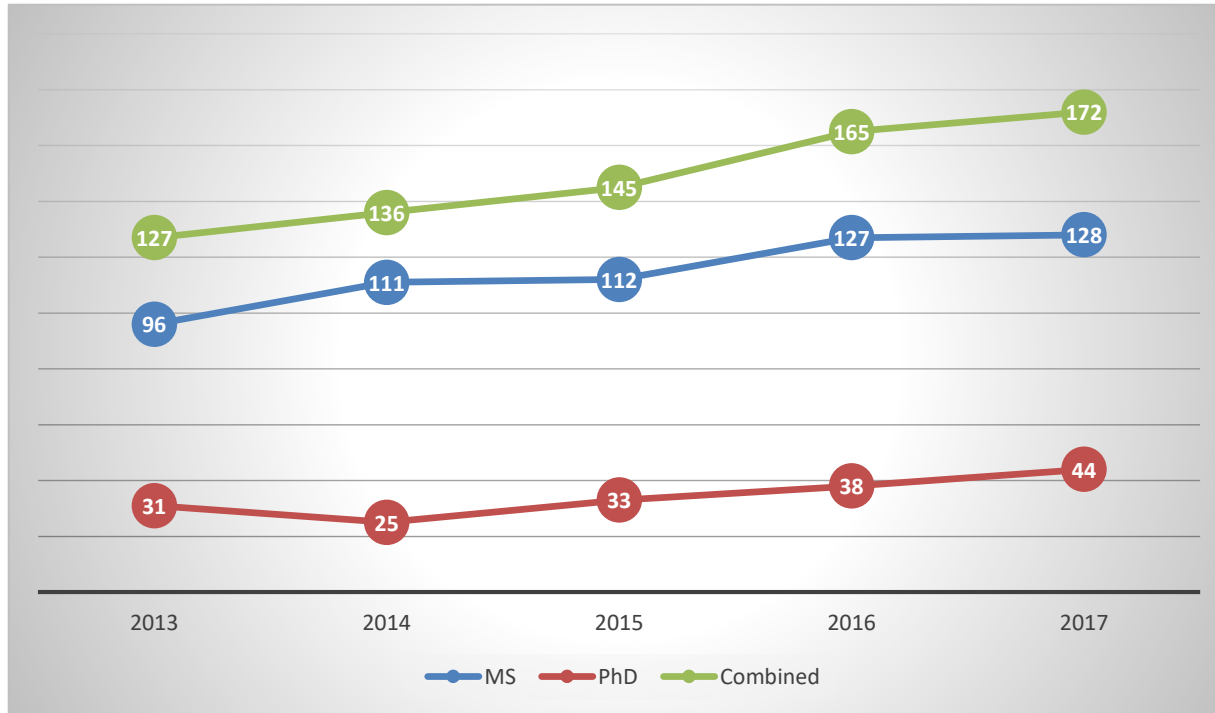

Research Expenditures

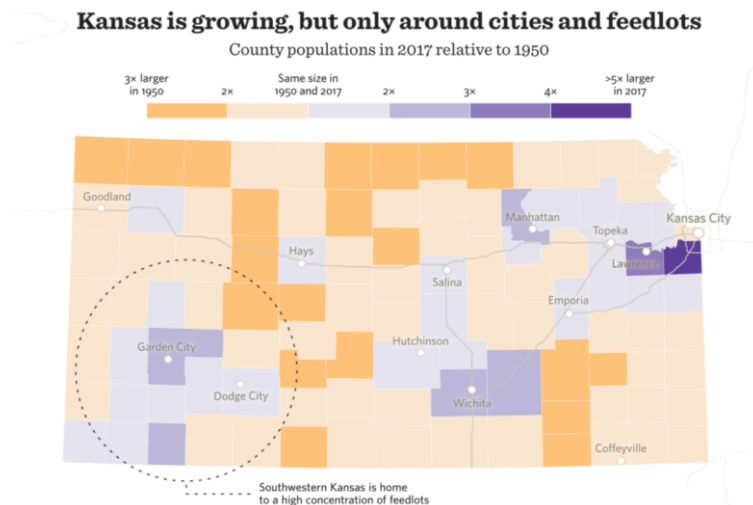


Graduate Degrees Awarded

Community Vitality

- Grant Writing Workshops
 - Delivered to local communities groups, not-for-profits, hospitals, public health groups and libraries
- To date, 23 workshops in over 20 counties
 - More than 550 participants
 - 93% increased confidence in grant writing
 - 97% learned new sources of data to document their needs
 - 96% learned new sources of grant funds

Developing Tomorrow's Leaders

- Ag Innovators Experience Grant
 - Three high school students traveled from Hays to Ames, IA to learn entomology during an intensive, on-campus weekend
 - Students returned to their community and taught 20 of their peers in 4-H
 - Emerging model of college and community partnerships investing in youth
- Master Community Facilitators
 - Targeting community teams of volunteers
 - Participants learn at home and then come together to practice their newly acquired skills with Extension professionals
 - Facilitate community dialogue of topics like: developing a culture of health, water, and economic development, among others.

Affordability is among the biggest challenges facing K-State students and their families today. In response, **Doug and Sabrina Kruse** have given a gift of \$500,000 to create **15** matching gift scholarships in the **College of Agriculture** as part of the new K-State Family Scholarship Program. This program is an initiative of the KSU Foundation to increase scholarship dollars to help K-State attract and retain students and to inspire new donors to invest in student success. KRUSE K-STATE FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP IN AGRICULTURE MATCH

HOW IT WORKS:

- Only 15 matching opportunities available.
- You give a gift of \$30,000 and Doug and Sabrina Kruse will match with \$30,000 = \$60,000 total gift.
- The match is given once the gift agreement is signed and the first pledge is received.
- Gift can be given in a lump sum or an annual pledge of \$6,000 for five years.
 - If pledged, \$4,000 goes to principal and \$2,000 is awarded.
 - If pledge payments are one year overdue, your money becomes expendable and the KSUF match money is returned to the KSUF fund.
- Gift fee will come out of the principal.
- Donor-requested criteria is limited to college or unit.
- Only two per household.

SUMMARY: KEY METRICS

Key Metrics

- Academic Programs
 - UG enrollment grew by about 40% from 2008 (1968) to 2014 (2780), and is now at 2512 (up 28% from 2008).
 - Multicultural enrollment more than tripled since 2008 from 120 to 366.
 - Placement is strong at 98% with approximately 60% for bachelor degree students remaining in Kansas.
 - The College and individual academic programs ranked highly.

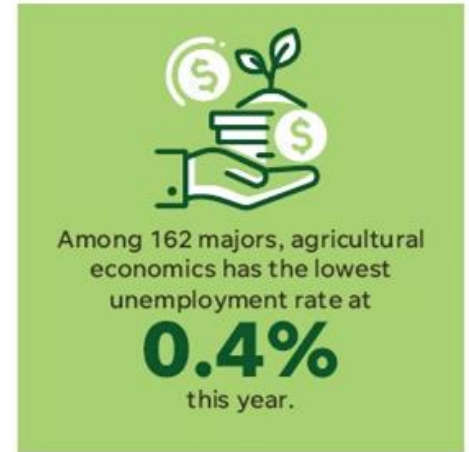
Key metrics: Academic Top 10s

Key Metrics

- Research and Extension
 - K-State Research and Extension contribution to K-State's Higher Education Research and Development (HERD) report to NSF represents 54% to university total.
 - The College is advancing private sector engagement in support of research and extension activities.
 - Over past 5 years, graduate degrees awarded have increased from 127 to 172, including an increase in PhDs awarded from 31 to 44 annually (42 % increase).

Key Metrics

- Research and Extension (continued)
 - Extension programming impacting communities through local training/empowerment of youth and adults.
 - K-State Research and Extension providing technical services to farmer-led irrigation technology farms.
 - Renewal of 3 of 4 USAID Feed the Future Labs without competition.

Key Metrics

- Fundraising/Development
 - Fundraising continues to be strong as College of Agriculture nears achieving 97% of Innovation and Inspiration goal through 83% if campaign.
 - Doug and Sabrina Kruse Family Scholarship in Agriculture will provide 15 matching scholarship opportunities for students in the College.
