



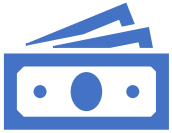

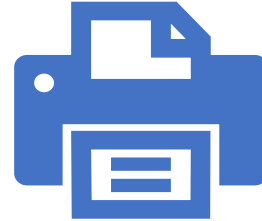


Negotiated a new license with Elsevier

Progress/Accomplishments

Moving curated and cleaned collections back to Hale Library after more than two years

Co-located Library Help with IT Help in Hale Library

Opened during pandemic to provide student study space and access to Internet

Interlibrary loan book requests were assessed to make eBook purchases for wider use

Shipped books (including prepaid return labels) to users during pandemic

Maintained library hours for patron services through Fall Semester

Progress/Accomplishments— Special Collections and Archives



- Acquired new collections including Office of the President, McCain Auditorium, A.Q. Miller School of Journalism and Mass Comm., and several emeritus faculty papers
- Hired assistant university archivist
- Consulted for remodel of Eisenhower Bedroom at the President's Residence

Key Metrics

- NLA (New Literacies Alliance—online information literacy tutorials)
 - 66 institutions use tutorials, including 12 new for 2020
 - 12,233 completed lessons from January 1 to October 26, 2020
- Research Guides (topical online library resource guides)
 - 80,960 views in 2020 from January 1 to October 26, 2020
- The Academic Services Department taught 135 classes and gave 477 reference/research consultations
- Books returned to Hale Library as of mid-November
 - 220,915 in Stacks A, B, C
 - Stack D in progress with refill rate of about one stack level per month
