Kansas State University encourages you to test out of courses in which you already have academic knowledge comparable to that gained in collegiate study.

Three national credit by examination opportunities are available: the College Level Examination Program (CLEP), the Defense Activity for Non-Traditional Education Support (DANTES), and the Excelsior College Exams. CLEP and DANTES tests can be scheduled through the Academic Assistance Center, 101 Holton Hall, 785-532-6492. The following registration fees are paid at the time of the examination: CLEP, \$85 per test; DANTES, \$90 per test.

Credit is awarded to students who are admitted and/or currently enrolled. If the letter grade is awarded, it will become part of your K-State GPA. This credit is considered resident credit and may be treated as prerequisites for subsequent courses. Non-graded credit by exam will not be counted against credit/no credit limits.

You must complete a minimum number of university general education (UGE) credit hours at K-State. Credit-by-exam hours may be considered "transfer credits" for purposes of the UGE policy. Consult your advisor.

Credit by exam listed on transcripts from other universities are not automatically awarded credit. Scores must be officially sent to K-State.

The humanities, social science–history, and natural sciences exams are not to be used in your major areas.

Biology may not be used to satisfy laboratory science graduation requirements.

Most colleges accept only letter-graded CLEP exams. Contact your advisor.

Please note: The CLEP scores listed are for exams taken through computer-based testing (CBT) only. Contact the Office of Admissions regarding scores for exams taken before July 2001.

Many dean's offices require acceptance of a grade, when applicable, in order to fulfill degree requirements.

Quiz-out examinations

K-State students who believe their past education or experience qualifies them to gain credit for a course may take special, locally constructed examinations for many of the courses offered on campus.

To quiz out of a course, you must receive permission from the head of the department in which the course is offered. In order to be eligible to quiz out of a course a student must be currently enrolled at K-State. Contact the appropriate department head for more information.

Credit by examination may receive letter grades of A, B, or C or the notation "Credit," as determined by the granting department. The credit will be treated as resident credit.
