



Some summary points

- Numbers of instructional faculty and research/extension faculty have dropped (- 1.3% and 4.5%, respectively), and administrative staff numbers have increased (+5%) during a time when student head count has increased by 7.4%.
- The percentage of the salary dollars devoted to instruction faculty has dropped (-.73%), the percentage of salary dollars devoted to research/extension faculty has dropped (-4.8%), while the percentage devoted to upper administration and administrative staff has increased (+1.44% and+ 3.89%) over the same time period.
- Faculty retirements have stayed fairly constant over the decade from 2004-2013.
- Faculty resignations (tenure denials or moving to another job) dropped during the recession years but are moving back to pre-recession levels. See chart below.
