Rationale and Impact (NEW)

Rationale*

BMB requests to expand the delivery format of BIOCH265 Introduction to Organic and Biochemistry to include on-line administration, by substituting home and virtual experiments for the hands-on, on-campus laboratory component, with the designation of the new class BIOCH266 Introduction to Organic and Biochemistry with Home and Virtual Laboratory. We will present the lecture component of the course (three 1-hr lectures per week), exactly the same as it occurs on campus, using video lectures that were recorded in the on-campus lecture hall. In place of the on-campus laboratory we will substitute two components: in-home, hands-on experiments, and virtual laboratory experiments. Students will purchase a take-home kit of 11 experiments from a commercial supplier. They will also receive a series of 11 virtual experiments in video format, that were performed by graduate teaching assistants. The requirements and grading of the class will remain about the same: whereas on campus students will write reports and be tested on the performance and outcomes of their own experiments, distance students will write reports on the performance and outcomes of the home and video experiments. We will award 5 credits for completion of this virtual lecture/laboratory course.

Impact Statement (i.e. if this impacts another unit)*

This change will not affect BMB majors, because BIOCH265/266 is not required in any of our degree programs. This change may affect students in other Colleges/Divisions/Units/Programs that require BIOCH265 for their degree requirements: whether they approve BIOCH266 as a substitute for BIOCH265 will be at their discretion. These include: Animal Science & Industry, Grain Science, Horticulture, Dietetics & Nutrition, Agronomy, Biology, Life Sciences, Kinesiology. I apprized these units by email on Dec. 11, 2017 of our intention to create this on-line class, but I have not yet heard comments or responses from them.

Rationale*

BMB requests to change the credit value of this laboratory course in general biochemistry from 2 to 3 credits. The rationale for this change is that over the past few years we revised the course to include an additional 1hour lecture period per week to support a connected series of more challenging, updated experiments that encompass new techniques in both biochemistry and molecular biology. Additionally, BMB acquired additional instrumentation that allows us to decrease the size of laboratory groups from 4 to 2 persons, resulting in more individual responsibility and more time commitment from each student. Thus the new lab syllabus requires students to complete more preparation for the laboratories, more individual activities during the laboratory period, and more data analysis and write-up subsequent the laboratory exercises. The increased expectations also involve the lecture component of the class, that now convenes twice a week for 1-hour periods.

Rationale*

BMB requests to expand the delivery format of an existing class (BIOCH522 General Biochemistry Laboratory) to include on-line administration, by substituting virtual experiments for the hands-on, on-campus laboratory component. We will designate the new class BIOCH523 Introduction to Biochemical Methods. We will present each of the existing experiments that take place in the General Biochemistry Laboratory, as virtual experiments that are performed by graduate teaching assistants and available to students in video format. The requirements and grading of the class will remain about the same: whereas on campus students will write reports and be tested on the performance and outcomes of their own experiments, distance students will write reports on the performance and outcomes of the video experiments. We will award 2 credits for completion of this virtual laboratory course BIOCH523, one credit less than credit value of the on-campus, hand-on version of BIOCH522.

This change will not affect BMB majors, because we require them to complete the on-campus, hands-on BIOCH522 General Biochemistry Laboratory. Rationale*

As the official accrediting body for colleges of veterinary medicine, the Council on Education (COE) requires that graduates be career-ready and proficient in a set of established core competencies. Although clinical

rotations have historically provided training in these competencies and will continue to do so, evidence-based research has demonstrated that the incorporation of clinical skills training into the pre-clinical curriculum can improve task-performance, increase student confidence, and decrease anxiety.

This course is the fourth in a series designed to provide veterinary students with a foundation in basic clinical and professional skills so students are introduced to key concepts that are essential for success in a clinical setting. Students will develop problem-solving and critical thinking skills, and be encouraged to apply what they are learning in the classroom to clinical cases so that they will be better prepared to meet expectations during their clinical year.

It has been a practice in recent times to go over and above the requirements by providing an introduction to computer architecture which is somewhat redundant given that other courses ECET 350, ECET 352, and ECET 450 provide good coverage of this material that is only required for ECET majors. This change serves to reduce the credit hour requirements for both the ETB-EC (Electronics and Computer) and ETB-RA (Robotics and Automation) Engineering Technology degree options. Reductions in the credit hour requirements is needed to meet/nearly meet the KBOR mandate that bachelor degree programs be 120 credit hours.

To reduce false or unsubstantiated opinions or assumptions they have of "others" and of themselves, students must examine the many patterns that characterize human groupings in U.S. culture — for example, those based on gender, race/ethnicity, sexual orientation, religion, political affiliation, (dis)ability, and socioeconomic class."

Rationale: The entire first unit (15-20% of the grade for the project + reading responses/class participation during that unit) is a project on human diversity, the process of become literate. This Literacy Landscape project asks students to map the invisible, structural, institutional forces at work in their learning how to read and write. In the Google Map they produce, they chart both real and imagined locations related to this process. To help them understand these forces, they read:

Deborah Brandt, "Sponsors of Literacy"--a piece which charts the invisible, structural forces that grease the wheels for some (the dominant class) and thwart others, such as: those who are geographically disadvantaged in terms of access to literacy/school/extracurriculars/language; those who are disadvantaged in ways that relate to family structure; those whose socioeconomic class is involved; multi-lingual speakers/writers; those without access to technology; those who are discriminated against because of race/gender/class/etc. In addition, they read/listen to/watch:

- * "Remembering Writing, Remembering Reading," also by Brandt, which pursues similar goals.
- * McIntosh, on white privilege
- * Blog post titled "Explaining Privilege to a Poor, Broke, White Person"
- * Pressure Cooker, a film about a culinary arts teacher/program that gets minority students in an underprivilege school in Philly access to college through a culinary arts training program and competition. This film combats pernicious, negative stereotypes about students of color and the "hard work"/bootstraps myth.
- * "As Black As You Wish to Be," a podcast episode on blackness and identity in a small Ohio town.
- * Flag Wars, a film about racial discrimination and gentrification
- * A two-part This American Life series on language discrimination, diversity, and segregation in education
- * Baron and Grimm, "Addressing Racial Diversity in the Writing Center: Stories and Lessons from Two Beginners" (one of the writers is a scholar of color).

In this unit, they also come up with key terms related to the above topics that address how one learns to read and write. The overall purpose is to tutors and teachers appreciate that everyone who comes to the Writing Center is going to have a different relationship to reading and writing, and that rather than mere "hard work" or "talent" being the progenitor of these differences, culture and society-wide forces, such as geography, "sponsorship", socio-economics, class, race, ethnicity, home/family dynamics, living in a resource-rich or resource-poor area, education, and many other forces are at work. We see this project, then, as deeply relevant to and reflecting "human diversity in the U.S."

The second half of the course is spent reading ESL Writers, by Shanti Bruce (scholar of color) and Ben Rafoth. Besides being edited by a scholar of color, at least 6 of the 18 articles are written by scholars of color, and all of the pieces address how to tutor international student writers in the U.S.. At least 3 are also written by international scholars and discuss international tutoring methods.

Additionally, students produce a 10-15 p research project throughout the second half of the course. Experientially speaking, I'd say at least ½ to ¾ of the projects relate to topics of human diversity (some recent topics include working with multi-lingual writers; disability and WCs, a frequent topic; high school WCs).

Students also complete an apprenticeship in the Center, which begins with observing sessions, then co-tutoring, and then solo tutoring. Every step of this involves thinking through human diversity in some way, as it is reflected

in writing. We explicitly discuss topics such as welcoming people to the Center, since bringing in writing is difficult for many; the gendered nature of help-seeking (which we discuss with statistics; the majority of WC usership and administration has been demonstrated to be by women); tutors' responsibilities towards social justice in the WC; and how to deal with racist or other offensive writing in the Center. We feel there are very few days of 500, overall, that do not relate to human diversity in some way. Rationale and Impact (NEW)

Rationale*

Soils have been mapped for about one hundred years, and for the first ninety of those years, the approach has been to relate soils to landscape position. For instance, deep clayey soils would be observed in wet floodplains, and hence similar wet floodplains would have those same soils assigned to them. This mapping approach, known as the soil-landscape paradigm, remains valid and successful, but is rapidly being replaced by computationally expensive methods based on statistics. These methods are easy to use and can be cheaper than the traditional approach if used judiciously. Most recently, the joint simulation of soil development and landscape evolution has added a clear time component to this mapping problem. All three approaches are discussed and evaluated in this course, while hands-on skills are practiced. All of this prepares our students for modern mapping, not just for soils, but of many landscape-related variables.


