



Rationale and Impact (NEW)

Rationale*

With current and new health care programs growing in our department and college, and changes in the healthcare system regarding documentation (electronic medical records, specifically), there is a need to expose our health and pre-health students to this material prior to becoming healthcare practitioners or entering their preferred postgraduate healthcare programs. There is a need to better prepare our students priort to placements in clinical practica and internships. This course will require students to understand nomenclature in order to interpret medical documents and record medical data.

Impact Statement (i.e. if this impacts another

After running an Impact Report via Curricullog, an impact was not noted. However, there is a course that is offered on occassion -- CLSCS 105: *Medical Terminology: Latin and Greek for Scientists*. It does not apply the concepts to clinical/disease situations, it focuses on Latin and Greek aspects of the terminology, and does not cover clinical documentation or medical records.

There may be an impact with students in our health-focused programs changing courses, as the proposed course will be required within our curricula.

At our meeting referenced in the following e-mail. Dr. Hillard, Dr. McCloskey, and I met to discuss this proposed course and CLSCS 105. There was general support for this more applied course. However, the use of "Terminology" was not supported, and it was discussed that assignments and coursework needed to differ from those in CLSCS 105. Thus, during a FNDH faculty meeting, we decided to enhance the course to reflect the applied aspects of the course via incorporation of SOAP notes assignments. Another unique distinction of this course is exposure to electronic medical recording of patient data.

Good afternoon, Derek, Please find the update syllabus attached for our course proposal. We discussed this in our college meeting and the committee suggested changing the title to be more in line with the outcomes of the course, which are to apply and use medical terms for better understanding health issues and for being able to better communicate/document within the health profession. This course is for health (FNDH Athletic Training and Dietetics) and pre-health
