Thanks for your message.

I have reached out to Mary Tolar for comment.

However, I do not see any impact on Leadership Studies. This course would be used as restricted elective for students in the Organizational Management track (Management major) and could be used as an elective for students in the Management Minor once that is in place. Within management, we have several courses that touch on both for-profit and not-for-profit businesses (e.g., Business Ethics) and we graduate students who go to work for non-profits. This course focuses on the administrative and managerial oversight of non-profit organizations but focuses on managerial functions, so I'm not sure where the impact would be.
