13 14 15	WHEREAS,	On Tuesday, October 5, 2021, approximately 100 Kansas State University (KSU) students met on Anderson Lawn to protest sexual violence at the University;

19 20 21	WHEREAS,	University President Richard B. Myers addressed protestors and requested a list of desired concrete action items from students;
22 23 24 25 26	WHEREAS,	Following the march, members of the KSU Student Governing Association (KSU SGA) collaborated with student protestors to create a preliminary list of action items and distributed it to President Myers and other university administrators;
26 27 28	WHEREAS,	KSU Administration officials have pledged their support in helping students mitigate the issue of sexual violence at the University;
29 30 31	WHEREAS,	Sexual assault prevention, awareness, and response should be prioritized by KSU Administration; and
32 33 34	WHEREAS,	KSU SGA has, through research and conversation with survivors and allies, created and refined this official list of recommendations to the University.
