

Called the "Silicon Valley for biodefense" because of its leadership in food safety and security and agrodefense, K-State is home to four Feed the Future Innovation Labs, an initiative by the U.S. Agency for International Development to increase food production in nations with limited resources. The university also is home to the Biosecurity Research Institute, a biosafety level-3 facility devoted to comprehensive infectious disease research and training. Construction is underway adjacent to the Manhattan campus of the federal government's National Bio and Agro-Defense Facility, which will be the nation's premier animal disease research facility.

Total research efforts at Kansas State University have led to 324 patents to date. The university has more than 90 research centers, including the 8,600-acre Konza Prairie Biological Station and the Johnson Cancer Research Center. University mace

The Kansas State University mace made its debut in September 2009 at the inauguration of Kirk H. Schulz as the university's 13th president. A mace is a decorative symbol of office and typically carried at the front of academic processions. Designed by Tom Boley, a 1970 K-State alumnus, the mace is made from a purple wood called purpleheart and a light-colored maple.

Academic dress

The history of academic dress dates to medieval European universities of the 12th century. Universities in the U.S. have standardized academic dress so its features are common and uniform throughout the country.

The gown — At K-State, gowns are black and typically made of synthetic material or worsted wool. The pattern varies with the degree held: open sleeves for the bachelor's degree; long, closed sleeves with slits for the hands for the master's degree; and round, bell sleeves for the doctoral degree.

The hood — Students receiving graduate degrees wear hoods. The master's hood is shorter than the doctoral hood and lacks the panels of the doctoral hood. Hoods are lined with the colors of the university; K-State's lining is purple with two inverted chevrons. The binding or edging of the hood is the color pertaining to the subject

The caps — All bachelor's and master's degree candidates wear a black mortarboard. Doctoral students may wear a mortarboard or a soft velvet tam with either six or eight sides. The tams can be dark blue or black for Doctor of Philosophy candidates, and light blue for Doctor of Education candidates. Doctor of Veterinary Medicine candidates wear a black mortarboard. Tassel color for all degree candidates depends on the degree and/or degree field.

Bachelor's degree candidates who are earning graduation honors from Kansas State University wear a purple-and-white honor cord on the left shoulder of their commencement gown. Honors are awarded based on their K-State grade point average. Eligible students also must have completed a minimum of 60 undergraduate hours at K-State, with at least 42 undergraduate hours in graded courses at K-State.

K-State graduation honors:

Summa cum laude — For students with a 3.95 or above GPA.

Magna cum laude — For students with a 3.85-3.949 GPA.

Cum laude — For students with a 3.75-3.849 GPA.

Note: Doctor of Veterinary Medicine degree candidates receive these honors based on courses completed in the professional program. For the purpose of the commencement ceremony, unofficial graduation honors are recognized for bachelor's degree candidates who possess the required K-State cumulative GPA prior to the start of the semester in which they plan to participate in the commencement ceremony, and who have completed or are currently enrolled in enough credit hours to satisfy the credit hour requirements.

member of the Kansas ABoard of Regents, Schmidt helps govern Kansas' six state universities, 19 community colleges, seven technical colleges and Washburn University.

Schmidt currently serves as the planned giving officer for Developmental Services of Northwest Kansas, a nonprofit charity that

serves persons with intellectual and developmental disabilities in 18 northwest Kansas counties. He

previously served as a state senator for the 36th District, which is made up of 10 rural counties in north central and northwestern Kansas.

A veteran, Schmidt retired as a colonel in the Army Medical Service Corps after serving for 32 years, including 12 years in the Army Reserve. He completed his career on active duty as the deputy commander for readiness of the Army Reserve Medical Command.

Schmidt serves on the Kansas Civil Service Board, the Governor's Council on Education, the Governor's KanCare Advisory Council, the Kansas Silver Haired Legislature, Senior Companions Board and a number of other school- and church-related boards and committees.

Schmidt earned a Bachelor of Arts from the University of Kansas, a Master of Science in school psychology from Fort Hays State University and a Master of Science in strategic studies from the U.S. Army War College.

A native of Ellis County, Schmidt was raised on a fifth-generation family dairy farm that he and his son have now converted into a local farm winery called Resurrection Vineyard. He and his wife, Ellen, have nine children and 19 grandchildren.

Speaker



Charles S. Taber

s the provost and A executive vice president of Kansas State University, Charles S. Taber provides strategic leadership on all aspects of university governance and the academic enterprise. Taber is the university's chief academic officer and is responsible for all undergraduate and graduate academic programs, overseeing academic

planning, resource allocation and innovation while ensuring excellence and relevance in the design of the curriculum. He is focused on the quality of teaching and learning; providing global perspective and strategic direction to successfully manage operating budgets; and enhancing the quality of the student experience at all levels.

The deans of the nine academic colleges, the K-State Libraries, Graduate School, Global Campus, the CEOs and deans of both K-State Polytechnic and K-State Olathe, and the director of the Staley School of Leadership Studies report to Taber. University offices also reporting to Taber include Academic Affairs, Institutional Effectiveness, Undergraduate Studies, International Programs, Sustainability and the Center for Engagement and Community Development. Taber, who works closely with K-State

President Richard Myers, serves as the university's chief executive officer in the president's absence.

Taber plays an essential role in the implementation of the Strategic Enrollment Management and Budget Modernization initiatives as the university works to stabilize and build enrollment and adopt a new budget model to better address the many funding challenges facing higher education. As the higher education landscape continues to evolve, he will address and identify opportunities to advance K-State's land-grant mission.

The provost also works closely with the KSU Foundation and President Myers on the university's comprehensive development campaign, is responsible for the university's academic reporting to the Kansas Board of Regents and serves on several boards, including K-State Athletics.

Taber came to K-State after serving as vice provost for graduate and professional education and dean of the Graduate School at Stony Brook University, New York, from 2013 through 2018. He joined Stony Brook in 1989 as an instructor of political science, earning a promotion to full professor in 2008. He served in many administrative positions at the university, including associate dean for postdoctoral affairs, dean of the School of Professional Development and interim provost and senior vice president for academic affairs. He also was involved with graduate enrollment management and addressing budget challenges in higher education.

A leading scholar in the fields of political psychology and computational modeling, Taber has more than 50 scholarly publications. Taber has been a pioneer in the use of computational modeling and political science and his work has earned millions of dollars in grant funding from the National Science Foundation. His research has contributed to the growing literature on the psychological mechanisms that drive public opinion. In 2000, he received the Paul Lazersfeld Outstanding Paper Award from the American Political Science Association for a paper on the causes of bias in political reasoning that was published in the American Journal of Political Science. Along with Milton Lodge, Taber developed an influential theory of unconscious thinking in political behavior. Their 2013 book, "The Rationalizing Voter," from Cambridge University Press, won the Robert E. Lane Book Award and the Book of the Year Awards from the Experimental Politics and Migration and Citizenship Sections of the American Political Science Association.

Taber earned his doctorate and master's degree in political science from the University of Illinois, Urbana-Champaign and a bachelor's degree in political science from East Tennessee State University.

University Distinguished Professors



Christine Aikens

Thristine Aikens is ✓an expert in physical chemistry and her research group aims to develop a theoretical understanding of the relationship between structure and properties of nanomaterials. She studies the structure and spectroscopic properties of gold and silver nanoparticles and nanoparticle arrays and the reactivity of

nanostructured metal oxide particles. Her current research aims to understand the fundamental physical principles that underlie plasmon-enhanced photocatalysis, which is a process that uses light to control chemical reactions in a way that requires less energy input than in currently used industrial catalytic processes.

Aikens came to K-State in 2007. Her research has been supported by more than \$3.2 million from organizations such as the National Science Foundation, the U.S. Department of Energy and the Air Force Office of Scientific Research.

She has published more than 110 articles in scientific publications and has given more than 150 professional presentations. She has served as a reviewer for 37 journals and a proposal/award reviewer for six organizations, including the National Science Foundation and the Department of Energy. She has organized eight conferences and has mentored more than 43 postdoctoral researchers and students, including high school, undergraduate and graduate students.

Aikens received the 2020 Women Chemists' Committee Rising Star Award; was honored with the Journal of Physical Chemistry A Lectureship in 2015; was named a Kavli Frontiers of Science fellow in 2012; was awarded an Alfred P. Sloan Research Fellowship and a Camille Dreyfus Teacher-Scholar Award in 2011; and received the NSF CAREER award in 2010. At K-State, she received the 2017-2018 Commerce Bank and W.T. Kemper Foundation Distinguished Graduate Faculty Award and the 2014 Segebrecht Distinguished Faculty Achievement Award.

Before joining K-State, Aikens was a postdoctoral research fellow at Northwestern University. She earned a doctoral degree in physical chemistry from Iowa State University and graduated summa cum laude with a bachelor's degree in chemistry from the University of Oklahoma.



Thomas Barstow

homas Barstow directs the Human Exercise Physiology Lab, where he studies the control of muscle metabolism, the integration of pulmonary and cardiovascular systems and the mechanisms of fatigue and exercise intolerance.

He has advised more than 76 undergraduate students, graduate students

and postdoctoral researchers. His research has been sponsored with nearly \$8.8 million from organizations such as NASA, the American Heart Association and the National Institutes of Health.

He has collaborated with scientists from Canada, Japan, the U.K., Belgium, France and Italy on a variety of research projects.

Barstow has published more than 170 peer-reviewed papers, 180 abstracts and four chapters. He has given 65 invited lectures and presentations. He is a fellow of the American College of Sports Medicine and the American Physiological Society. At Kansas State University, he is a three-time recipient of the Professorial Award for Sustained Excellence, a two-time recipient of the Making a Difference Award from the Women in Engineering and Science Program, and received and the Faculty Research Excellence Award from the College of Health and Human Sciences.

Before joining K-State in 1996, Barstow served in research and faculty positions at the University of California, Davis; Harbor-UCLA Medical Center; and V.A. Wadsworth Medical Center. From 2002 to 2003, he was a visiting professor at The Manchester Metropolitan University in Manchester, United Kingdom.

Since 2007, Barstow has served as the graduate program coordinator for the university's department of kinesiology. He earned a doctoral degree in physiology, a master's degree in physical education and a bachelor's degree with honors in nutrition all from the University of California, Davis.

Thomas Phillips

world leader in research A and applications of integrated management of stored product pests, Thomas Phillips' expertise in chemical ecology and insect behavior has contributed to his success in designing monitoring and mating disruption systems for insects. Insects account for more than half of human food that is lost postharvest

in developing countries. Phillips' development of holistic management systems addresses this critical issue related to food security.

Phillips' research has been supported by more than \$9 million in grants and has led to the publication of 164 journal articles and 15 books or book chapters.

He has given numerous research presentations, including approximately 80 invited talks.

Phillips' significant contributions to graduate education at K-State include advising or co-advising 14 master's and 16 doctoral students who have been successfully employed in academia and industry, with many now national or international leaders in their fields. He also has mentored 15 postdoctoral scientists and visiting researchers during his career. Phillips promotes graduate student professional development, encouraging students to participate in professional conferences and outreach activities as well as to seek funding and engage in networking

Phillips earned his doctorate in biology with a concentration in entomology from SUNY College of Environmental Science and Forestry. He served on the faculty of Oklahoma State University and the University of Florida, as well as the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Agricultural Research Service in Madison, Wisconsin, and Hilo, Hawaii. He joined K-State's entomology department in 2007 and served as department head until 2011. He has taught classes in general entomology, insect chemical ecology, forest and shade tree insects, dendrology and stored product entomology.

A subject editor for Stored Product Insects, a part of the Journal of Economic Entomology, for nearly 20 years, Phillips currently serves on the journal's editorial board. His work has been recognized with numerous awards, including the U.S. Department of Agriculture Certificate of Merit, Wendell E. Burkholder Award for Excellence in Stored Product Protection and the New Product Development Award from the Entomological Society of America. He was named the Donald Wilbur Sr. endowed professor for stored product protection at K-State.



Donghai Wang

onghai Wang has established an internationally known research program on bioconversion of renewable materials into biofuels, chemicals and biomaterials, including protein adhesives, resins, and biodegradable composites; and nearinfrared technology for analysis of physical and chemical properties of biomaterials.

He has conducted fundamental and applied research to overcome technical barriers for cost-effective production of biofuels from both starch-based feedstocks such as corn, sorghum and millets, and cellulosic biomass such as grass, crop residues and woody biomass. Wang also collaborates with materials scientists to develop biodegradable protein-based adhesives and oil-based resins. He conducts research on development of near-infrared spectroscopy models as rapid methods for analysis and characterization of physical and chemical

properties of biomaterials. He has established research collaborations with engineers and scientists across the K-State campus and nationwide, and has been involved in several large national research projects. He also serves as co-director of the Bio Material and Technology Laboratory at K-State.

Wang has served as principal investigator on more than 40 projects and co-principal investigator for more than 30 projects. This funded work has exceeded \$23 million, with about \$5.5 million in direct support of his research. The holder of three U.S. patents, he has authored or co-authored 210 peer-reviewed journal articles and 15 book chapters and more than 180 meeting papers and presentations. Wang has served the professional community as associate editor of the Transactions of the American Society of Agricultural and Biological Engineers and for Applied Engineering in Agriculture. He also served on several panels and technical committees.

Among Wang's contributions to graduate education at K-State include advising or co-advising 11 master's and 24 doctoral students. Eight of his previous doctoral students are employed as faculty at universities or as research scientists or engineers

at large industries. Since 2002, Wang also has contributed to graduate education through his service on the biological and agricultural engineering graduate committee.

Wang earned his doctorate in biological and agricultural engineering from Texas A&M University. He joined K-State's Carl and Melinda Helwig Department of Biological and Agricultural Engineering in 2001. Wang's research has earned several national and international awards from the American Society of Agricultural and Biological Engineers, including best paper awards in 2011, 2013 and 2015, and the Rain Bird Engineering Concept of the Year Award in 2010 and 2016. He received the U.S. Department of Agriculture Certificate of Appreciation Award in 2008 and the Applied Energy Journal Award for highly cited research and reviewed paper in 2016. From the Carl R. Ice College of Engineering at K-State, Wang has received the Frankenhoff Outstanding Research Award in 2009 and 2015, Engineering Distinguished Researcher Award in 2019 and was named a Robert and Becca Reichenberger — Carl and Mary ICE Cornerstone teaching scholar in 2019.


