The recipient(s) of this scholarship will be undergraduate student(s) properly enrolled in any curriculum at Kansas State University.2. The recipient(s) must be first-generation/historically under-represented student who is a participant in Project IMPACT.3. The recipient(s) must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5, based on a 4.0 scale.4. The recipient(s) must be a permanent resident of the United States.5. Undergraduate in any curriculum eligible. Preference will be given to students enrolled in the Colleges of Agriculture, Business Administration, & Engineering, as the majors in Project IMPACT.
