The Kansas State University Amateur Radio Club, WØQQQ placed third this year in the college/university category of the ARRL Fall School Club Roundup with 49,560 points. Operators Vern, WØVMP, David, KAØJPM, James, KDØICP, Glen, KCØGVP, Max, W2MAX, and Jill, KM6UWL ran the station over the contest's five-day period.

This is the fifth time WØQQQ has participated in School Club Roundup, and the highest score to date. Band conditions were not favorable early in the week, but conditions improved by Wednesday to allow for several good days of operating. The station operated mainly on 20 and 40 meters. Club president James Copeland and member Jill Drake have been busy responding to the many QSLs arriving in the mail.

According to legend, the K-State club has been around since 1927. The station is located on the fourth floor of Seaton Hall on the campus and is equipped with excellent facilities including a expansive antenna farm with a TH6DXX beam on a 40-foot tower on the roof, a UHF and VHF repeater system, and multiple operating positions. Comments on League Happenings

It's been a month of very light inputs for the newsletter – understandable with the Holidays and the winding down of Hamfests, Special Events, and other field activities. So I thought to use some of the newsletter space to briefly summarize some of the changes happening at the league. As always I'm interested to hear your views on these or any other topics.

ARRL Board of Director Elections – The board is composed of an elected director from each of the 15 ARRL divisions. Similarly a vice-director is elected from each division. The 15 vice-directors attend the board meetings, serve on committees, provide consultation to the director, and stand ready to fill in for the director in case of his absence for any reason. Board motions are decided by the 15 directors only; the officers and vice-directors have no vote.

Every year elections for director and vice-director are held in 5 divisions. The term of office is 3-years. Thus a third of the board is up for election every year. This year elections were held in these divisions: Hudson, Roanoke, New England, Northwestern, and Central. The incumbent directors were defeated in Hudson, Roanoke, and New England divisions. The Northwestern director announced his retirement upon completing his term and in a three-way race, the incumbent Vice-Director was narrowly defeated. Central division's incumbent director was narrowly re-elected.

On January 1, 2019 the four newly elected directors will begin their terms and attend their first board meeting only three weeks later. Also attending an ARRL board meeting for the first time will be our newly appointed CEO, Howard Michel, WB2ITX, who will have been in office all of 3 months.

I will certainly miss the out-going board members whose knowledge, skills, and experience I respect and value (though we didn't always agree on some issues). But with new people come new ideas, new perspectives, and new experiences to bear on the issues and challenges. Amateur Radio is changing and we need to manage this change skillfully and carefully. I welcome your input on any topic as we move into the new year and I will work diligently to represent the views and values of the Midwest Division members.


