Placement will be adjusted if necessary to ensure students are placed into the program at the level that matches their ability. Note on Retroactive Credit: Students can capitalize on their previous language experience through retroactive credit. That is, if a student places into a third-semester course for example, enrolls, and completes the course with a grade of C or better, they may earn **retroactive credit** for a preceding course in the language sequence (i.e. second-semester language study). This represents an enormous savings, so it is of benefit to students to place into the program at the level that best matches their ability.

SPAN 411 (15449) - Heritage Speakers Spanish Composition & Grammar

Do you speak Spanish at home? This course is for you)

Dr. Valentín Rivera, TuTh 2:30-3:45

This course is intended to help heritage speakers (individuals that have learnt the language given the early exposure to it at home and who have primarily completed their academic preparation in English while living in

the US), to further their literacy skills in Spanish. This course promotes a) the awareness of the existence of different linguistic variations of the Spanish language, b) an appreciation of the very unique variation of Spanish developed in the US, while motivating students to aspire to developing a standard register. This course also reinforces grammatical features and assists students in acquiring a sophisticated and academic lexicon, as well as further developing skills to express their ideas in more complex and professional settings. Finally, this course explores the current socioeconomic and political situations of different Hispanic countries.
