University Snapshot:

Faculte D'agronomie et De Medecine Veterinaire (FAMV)

Founded in 1924, FAMV has always provided trained agronomists, agricultural agents, veterinarians and veterinary nurses to Haiti and the world. It is part of the State University of Haiti (since 1968), the largest university in Haiti.

For Agricultural teaching, research and teaching are organized around seven departments and a few teaching laboratories. In the first three years students take basic science classes, and then they specialize (Years 4 and 5) in the departments of Economy and Rural Development, Animal Production, Plant Science, Agricultural Engineering, Natural Resources and Environment, and Food Science and Technology. Both BS and MS programs are available, with emphases on crop production and animal production.



The teaching and research faculty at FAMV have years of experience in conducting field based research, unlike many universities in Haiti a majority of those faculty are full-time. Their experiment farm is located close to campus, allowing students a local place to conduct research. Eighty-five percent of their buildings are new, post earthquake. This includes dormitory facilities.

Faculty at FAMV are dedicated and committed to teaching and training students within Haiti. Many of their own graduates come back to FAMV to work as researchers and teachers.

As a state school FAMV has an excellent working relationship with the Ministry of Agriculture, and is engaged in many partnerships with private sector entities and other governmental organizations.
